
CEF Meetings: 1st Monday of the month - 6:00pm

General Operations	\$ 204,000
Grants for Student Tuitions	\$ 24,662
Student Scholarships	\$ 10,155
Teacher Scholarship	\$ 1,000
Building Maintenance and Improvements	\$ 172,332
Gift Card/Scrip Payout for Student Tuition	\$ 2,569
Other Support	\$ 22,109

TOTAL: \$ 436,784




Learning About Ancient Greece

Ms. Parkes' Sophomore World History class has a special way of learning about the Ancient Greeks. In the fall, while studying the Greeks, the class gets to compete in their very own 'Ancient Olympics'. The class studies the culture, food, religion, language, government, and geography of Ancient Greece. They are then put into teams, each of which represents a different city-state of Ancient Greece. The students then write their own City-State Anthem and create their own flag to represent their team. The class then participates in 2 days of Olympic competition, vying for the gold in events such as the long jump, short and long distance running, javelin throw, and more. To end the week, the class prepares a typical Greek meal together to enjoy some of the same things the Greeks would have! The competition was close, but the Spartans came out as the Rivet Greek Olympic Champions for the 2022-2023 school year!

Get Your Teach On

In August, Flaget Elementary was selected as one of eight schools in the state to be a Get Your Teach On Collaboration Site through a partnership between the Indiana Department of Education and Get Your Teach On. Thus far, the GYTO facilitator, Chris Pombonyo, has visited three times with one more visit planned. Teachers have participated in mini-PD sessions, mentoring, model lessons taught by Mr. Pombonyo, and co-teaching all focusing on engagement strategies, collecting data, and focusing on learning targets.

Ten Flaget teachers recently attended a GYTO Conference in North Carolina to extend what they have learned through being part of a GYTO Collaboration Site. Each teacher received dynamic, research-based professional development specific to the grade level they teach. This one-of-a-kind experience also allowed teachers to share their passion and enthusiasm for education with others in the field. 

















